Buildings update. I have been contacted this week by the city council to inform me that they are coming next week to complete the entrance to the car park adjacent to Church. A wider structure is to be fitted indicating "one way in and one way out". It will have a height restriction and will not compromise the pathway for families that will eventually have railings next to Father Simon's hedge. It will however mean that the car park will have to close whilst this work is undertaken, **therefore it will be closed from 10.00am on Monday 13th (it can be used before school on Monday) and reopened on Thursday 16th.** There is no good time to do this and I have been asking them to complete the work ASAP. Suffice to say it will be a marked improvement on what is there currently, so any inconvenience in the short term will hopefully be offset with a new safer entrance for all of us to use for many years to come.
