Term Dates. School breaks up for half term today **Friday May 25th**, returning on **Monday June 4th**. School breaks up for the summer holidays on **Friday July 20th at 1.00pm**, please also note that there are two more Teacher Days this term **Friday June 22nd and Friday July 6th**.

Reception 2018. 2018 has been the most difficult year to date securing places for everyone that wants to come to St Margaret Marys. A number of families had been placed in a very difficult position because of applying late or not applying correctly. This resulted in a number of siblings not initially securing places in school. After intense discussions we are now in a position to resolve the “problem”. School will be admitting an extra 12 children into Reception for 2018. For 2019 however this situation cannot arise again as I'm not sure “intense discussions” will be enough to secure any extra places. The overwhelming majority of children coming to school are baptised Catholic children (78% of the original 45 children are baptised catholic children) this will be the same next year; *so can I please urge anyone who has a child of school age 2019 that wants to discuss baptism to please speak to myself or Father Simon (373 0069)*. A further reminder also that a place in our Nursery does not automatically mean you will be offered a place at school, so please can I ask if anyone has any questions/queries please come and see me.

Extra-Curricular Clubs. A reminder that due to the building works both at the front/rear of school **we will have to suspend all clubs after half term.** There will be additional vehicles/machinery and work going on after half term which unfortunately means it will prove very difficult to run clubs after school safely. This will only be for the last half term and come September, everything will return to normal as the building work is due for completion at the end of the summer holidays.

GDPR. Families may have seen, heard or read about the new General Data Protection Regulations that are due to come into effect at the end of May. All schools hold data and we have been challenged to respond to this to make sure that we are compliant with the new regulations. There are a number of steps we need to follow along this process the first of which is to point you in the direction of our website where you will be able to find our “Privacy notice”. This is a document that outlines what data we hold, how we store it and who we share it with and why. Schools need to store, share and file data to enable us to fulfil our statutory duty so please do take a look at it and if you have any questions relating to it don’t hesitate to contact me.

Building Update. The playground at the rear of school is now almost complete, the doorway to provide access to it is to be completed during half term so all things being equal the children will be playing there on our return.

Car Park. On a separate note I have a meeting scheduled for the first week back with representatives from the city council. This will be to consider the final stage of improvements to the car park adjacent to church and any other landscaping issues that need attending to around the school entrance. I will update everyone as the council’s plans/timetable on our return after half term.
