The children (and some staff) dressed up in protective clothing whilst Mrs Murphy explained to them the significance of each item and how it protects you. I want to write and formally thank Lovells for coming in to talk to the children but also for being very supportive neighbours to St Margaret Marys whilst the building work is going on.
