All Saints / All Souls. Our new half term began with an assembly on Monday focusing on All Saints and All Souls. I spoke to the children about the example the Saints set for us by the way they lived and acted. We also discussed how at this time of year we think about and remember those that are no longer with us but are with Jesus in Heaven. We talked about Remembrance Sunday (13<sup>th</sup>) and I told the children that our Book of Remembrance will be displayed in the hall between now and the beginning of Advent. Poppies will be sold in school and the children will be asked to enter the names of anyone in their family that they would like us to remember in the coming weeks, this we will do at assemblies, prayer services and school masses.

Thank you to Mrs Logue and the Y5 readers for leading our Mass on Tuesday to mark All Saints day, thanks also to Mrs Hayes for overseeing our All Saints Prayer service for our youngest children.

This piece of land has been a redundant space for many years but with the help of a number of parties I am hoping to turn it into our KS1 playground. This process has now begun and I want to thank Lovells (the building contractor) in particular for their help over half term in preparing the area.
