Dear Parents,

<u>The Epiphany.</u> Monday saw the spring term begin and in many ways the Christmas season draw to a close. We marked this with our assembly when for the final time this year the children looked at our crib in the hall. Our focus was the three visitors that brought Gold Frankincense and Myrrh. Gifts fit for a king, gifts for a king born in a stable. I spoke to the children about how in many ways the different visitors that came to the stable in Bethlehem like the three kings or the shepherds for example, demonstrated that Jesus came for all of us. Regardless of whom we are or where we are from Jesus came at Christmas for everyone.

I want to write and thank everyone for their efforts at the end of last term. We once again marked Christmas as a school family, remembering that "Jesus is the reason for the Christmas season". **Family Mass Sunday January 29<sup>th</sup> 2017 at 10.00am.** Please do make a note in your diaries of our next Family Mass.
