## Week beginning Monday December 3<sup>rd</sup> 2018. Thought for the week: "Awake, Awake, Be Ready!"

**ADVENT 2018**. Our week will begin on Sunday with our Family Mass. We will light the first purple candle, which symbolises 'hope'. We can have hope because God is faithful and he will keep the promises he made to us. Indeed our hope comes from God! Thank you in advance to Mr Barton for organising our Mass. In assembly on Monday, we will light the first candle on our Advent wreath and celebrate all the Advent promises we have made in class. We will talk together about the symbols on the Advent wreathe, it is circular in shape because like God's love a circle has no beginning and no end; it is covered in evergreens to show that God's love is also everlasting and finally that there are different coloured candles that represent different ideas, this week ahead being "hope". Advent is divided into two parts waiting for Jesus to come again (hence the need to be awake), and waiting for Jesus to be born on Christmas day.
