**First Holy Communion 2020 Congratulations to Zion, Gabriela, Makoborero, Liliana and Oliwia who all made their First Holy Communion this morning.** Many thanks to the parents concerned for their understanding and patience and again my thanks to Father Simon and Mr Barton for all their hard work.

**School Feast Day 16<sup>th</sup> October St Margaret Mary Alacoque.** Our school celebrates its patron, St Margaret Mary today. St Margaret Mary Alacoque was a nun of the order of the Visitation of Holy Mary. She was a devout, humble and selfless person who is a role model to all of us. In these challenging times, we can use her example as an inspiration. As a school we would normally all attend Mass, sadly, we cannot do this but we have marked the day with extra treats and some time for us all to reflect on the all too brief but extraordinary life of St Margaret Mary Alacoque. Every year group has put up a display about St Margaret Mary outside their classrooms and every year group has completed some work about her life. *Please also note there is a special Mass in Church this evening at 7:30pm to celebrate our feast day. We cannot gather properly in the hall at the moment, but each class will put the names of loved ones in the book and we will remember them throughout November. **Coronavirus.** *The Government introduced and outlined their new three-tier system of local restrictions this week. Birmingham has been designated as Tier 2 “High risk”. From a school perspective however nothing has really changed, schools will remain open in England with local outbreaks being managed similarly to the way we have managed Y2 over the last two weeks.*
