ADVENT 2020. This weekend marks the third Sunday of Advent when we will light the third candle on our Advent wreathe. Whilst the first candle represented "hope", the second purple candle symbolised "faith" or "love". The third candle is a different colour it is rose coloured or pink. The third Sunday of Advent is also known as Gaudete Sunday, which comes from the Latin word "rejoice" hence the brightly coloured candle. It can often be seen as the halfway point through Advent as our attention turns directly to Jesus coming on Christmas day. In school, we were fortunate to join with CAFOD and other schools across the country for their virtual Advent assembly "Light of the World" yesterday. CAFOD have for many years, done splendid work helping those most in need across the world, a powerful message beautifully presented. Thanks to Mr Barton for overseeing the assembly as it was a lovely way to mark the third Sunday by joining with together to "get ready".

FSM Christmas Holiday Vouchers 2020. The plan is to allow eligible families to be able to access their vouchers from Wednesday 16th. End of term dates. School will break up for the Christmas holiday at 3:00pm on Thursday December 18th. The children return to school on Monday January 4th 2021.

Coronavirus checklist for the Christmas break.

For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. Parents will need to notify school via the e-mail address enquiry@stmgtmry.bham.sch.uk. This e-mail address will be monitored throughout the day.

Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first 6 days following the end of term, schools do not need to be informed about their absence until the first day of the new term.
