For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. Parents will need to notify school via the e-mail address <u>enquiry@stmgtmry.bham.sch.uk</u>. This e-mail address will be monitored throughout the day.

Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact-tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after the first 6 days following the end of term, schools do not need to be informed about their absence until the first day of the new term.

Finally, this has been the most challenging term I think our school has ever had to face. We have had to deal with things none of us ever thought we would have to. To each and every member of staff I want to offer my thanks and admiration for everything they have done over the last 15 weeks. I am very lucky to have such a dedicated group of people to work with.
