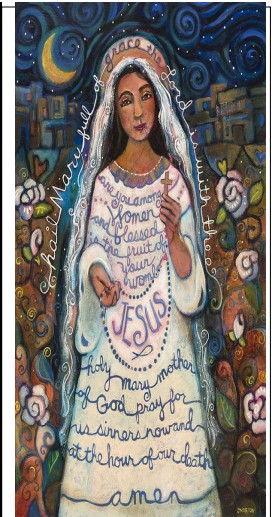
Fayre in July
