I hope this finds you all well as we approach the end of another busy and successful week at St Margaret Mary RC School. In our faith journey this week, pupils have been learning about *Saints Peter and Paul*, identifying their importance and the significance of their roles in our *Catholic faith*. They are both considered foundational figures for the Church, despite their distinct backgrounds and roles. *Peter*, initially a *fisherman*, was chosen by Jesus as a leader and the *"rock"* upon which the Church would be built. Paul, initially a persecutor of Christians, experienced a dramatic conversion and became the "*Apostle to the Gentiles*," traveling extensively to spread the Gospel.

Please note that school will be closed tomorrow for our penultimate training day of the academic year. Our final training day is scheduled for *Monday 21st July*, and I encourage you to check our website for all important dates moving forward.

Our pupils have had some wonderful educational experiences this week. **Year 2** thoroughly enjoyed their visit to **Kingsbury Water Park** as part of their study on **Habitats**. The children had a superb day exploring and pond dipping, and I'm grateful to the team for overseeing this enriching trip. Similarly, **Year 1** visited the **Nature Centre** in Birmingham to support their learning about **Animals**. They enjoyed a fascinating tour of the Reserve and observed a plethora of different animals and reptiles.

Year 4 had an engaging computing workshop this week, playing and exploring with **Microbits** while delving into **programming** concepts. It was a thoroughly enjoyable session that brought their learning to life. Meanwhile, our **Year 6** pupils enjoyed their tour of **Alexander Stadium** today as part of their topic on **Sporting History**. This is a fabulous resource we have here in Birmingham, and the children were captivated by the experience.

The *EYFS* team, under Mrs Marks' excellent leadership, have been busy meeting and welcoming all our new pupils and parents during *induction* this week. We very much look forward to working with all our current and new families in the coming academic year.
