The Liturgy of the Word

The reader proclaims the first reading.

First reading: Sirach 3.2-6, 12-14. He who fears the Lord honours his parents.

At the conclusion, the reader says: **The word of the Lord.** 

People: Thanks be to God.

The Gradual, or Responsorial Psalm

**Psalm response:** Blessed are all who fear the Lord, who walk in his ways.

Second reading: Colossians 3.12-21. The Christian life in the family.

Gospel Acclamation (Alleluia or Tract) may be sung or said before the Gospel.

#### All Stand

The Lord be with you.

People: And with thy spirit.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to N.

People: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Gospel: Luke 2.41-52. They found Jesus in the temple, sitting among the teachers.

After the Gospel: The Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise be to thee, O Christ.

The Homily

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible;

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven,

and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man;

#### Stand

and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the quick and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end. And I believe in the Holy Ghost the Lord, the Giver of Life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son: who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; who spake by the Prophets.

And I believe one holy Catholic and Apostolic Church; I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead,

▲ and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Penitential Rite

Ye that do truly and earnestly repent you of your sins, and are in love and charity with your neighbours, and intend to lead a new life, following the commandments of God, and walking from henceforth in his holy ways: draw near with faith, and make your humble confession to Almighty God, meekly kneeling upon your knees.

All Kneel. Silence may be kept.

Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, maker of all things, judge of all men:

We acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness, which we from time to time most grievously have committed, by thought, word, and deed, against thy divine Majesty, provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us.

We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings; the remembrance of them is grievous unto us, the burden of them is intolerable.

Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father; for thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life, to the honour and glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

## The Priest says:

May Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who of his great mercy hath promised forgiveness of sins......and bring us to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

## The Liturgy of the Eucharist

All sit for the Offertory chant and hymn

O little town of Bethlehem, How still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep The silent stars go by Yet in thy dark streets shineth, the everlasting light; The hopes and fears of all the years Are met in thee tonight.

O morning stars together Proclaim the holy birth, And praises sing to God the King, And peace to men on earth; For Christ is born of Mary, and gathered all above While mortals sleep the angels keep their watch of wondering love

How silently, how silently The wondrous gift is given! So God imparts to human hearts the blessing of his heaven. No ear may hear his coming; But in this world of sin, Where meek souls will receive him, still The dear Christ enters in.

O holy child of Bethlehem, Descend to us, we pray; Cast out our sin and enter in, Be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels The great glad tidings tell: O come to us, abide with us, Our Lord Emmanuel.

When the Offertory is concluded the Priest says: Pray, brethren, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable unto God, the Father almighty.

The people stand and respond: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at thy hands, for the praise and glory of his Name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

The Prayer over the Offerings is sung or said.

People: Amen.

#### THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Priest begins the Eucharistic Prayer with the Preface Dialogue.

The Lord be with you.

People: And with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up unto the

Lord.

Let us give thanks unto the

Lord our God.

People: It is meet and right so to do.

The Priest sings or says the Preface, at its conclusion:

Kneel as the Eucharistic Prayer continues.

Priest: The mystery of faith.

People: O Saviour of the world, who by thy Cross and precious Blood hast redeemed us: save us and help us, we humbly beseech thee, O Lord.

The Eucharistic Prayer concludes with the Doxology, which may be sung or said, followed by the Great Amen:

...world without end.

People: AMEN.

All stand.

#### The Communion Rite

As our Saviour Christ hath commanded and taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, but deliver us from evil.

#### The priest alone continues:

Deliver us, O Lord, we beseech thee, from all evils, past, present.....ever both be free from sin and safe from all distress.

## The People respond:

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Peace Remain standing, the Priest says:

O Lord Jesus Christ, who saidest to thine Apostles, Peace I leave you.....with the Father and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And with thy spirit.

All kneel.

Priest: Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

People. Therefore let us keep the feast.

Prayer of Humble Access

Remain kneeling. The Priest says with all who shall receive Communion:

We do not presume to come to this thy Table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness,

but in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy Table. But thou art the same Lord whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his Blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his Body, and our souls washed through his most precious Blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us.

Amen.

# The Priest shows the Host to the People and says aloud:

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him that taketh away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the Supper of the Lamb.

# The People respond together with the Priest:

Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof, but speak the word only, and my soul shall be healed.

And we humbly beseech thee, O heavenly Father, so to assist us with thy grace, that we may continue in that holy fellowship, and do all such good works as thou hast prepared for us to walk in; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with thee and the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, world without end. Amen.

Remain kneeling for the Post communion Prayer.

Priest: Let us pray... ...through Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.
