This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

# Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Our approach is based on the Model Music Curriculum, which focuses on singing, listening, composing. Improvising, reading, and performing (including pulse/beat/rhythm and pitch).

The whole school teaches music every Friday and the teaching is delivered by a number of specialist music teachers. Each class has a regular timetabled slot, lasting for between 30 and 45 minutes. EYFS, Key Stage 1 and Year 3 receive music lessons and singing. Various tuned and untuned instruments are utilised in these sessions whilst using the Charanga scheme to ensure progression in skills. Year 4, 5 and 6 have specialist brass lessons. All children learn and play the cornet (year 4), tenor horn (year 5) and tenor horn or trombone (year 6).

Music is also taught throughout the children's topic work. Specific listening, appraisal and composing skill are taught throughout each topic. Children are also exposed to different other musical opportunities through listening afternoons where different genres of music are explored to enhance topic work and also for pleasure. # Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Upper Key Stage 2 children are invited to join the school choir. As well as holding a celebration performance at the end of the summer term, the choir also supports the school in a number of sacramental masses, such as Confirmation in November and First Holy Communion in May/June.

# Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.
