The Tudors were a royal family of **English kings and queens.** They ruled between 1485 and 1603.

Reigned for 9 days

The Houses of York and Lancaster were fighting because they both wanted to rule England. The symbol of the House of York was a white rose, and Lancaster had a red rose. Henry VII won the Wars of the Roses and married Elizabeth of York to spread peace. Their new rose was both red and white and It was called the **Tudor Rose**.

The Five Oceans:

Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern, Arctic.

Queen Elizabeth sent Francis Drake on an expedition to the Americas.

Drake sailed the seas on a boat called The Golden Hind.

He took a journey with 164 men to exp ships and items. His route has been plotted on the world map.

He was given a knighthood for his voyage around the globe.

Vocabulary	
reign	To rule as a monarch. For example, a king or queen reigns over their country.
Monarch	A person who rules over a kingdom or place. For example: a king, queen or emperor.
artefacts	A man-made object, such as pieces of art or tools that are of historical interest.
route	A way of travel or movement: from point A to point B.
portrait	Artwork of a person. Hans Holbein painted famous portraits of King Henry VIII.
connected device	Electronic devices that can connect with each other via the internet. For example: Alexa, tablets, smart speakers and TVs.
balanced diet	Eating the right amount of foods from the different food groups: carbohydrates, proteins, dairy and fruits and vegetables.
composer	A person who writes music. Thomas Morley was a composer who wrote My Bonnie Lass.

Birmingham Inventors: John Mitchell

John Mitchell invented the machine-made steel pen point in 1822. In the 1800s, there were 100 pen factories in the Jewellery Quarter.


