

Topic: Gardens	
RE	Creation and Covenant- Children will learn about the first creation story in <i>Genesis</i> and how it tells us how God creates everything out of nothing through his word and his spirit, God creates humans in the image and likeness of God, because we have dignity we should treat every person with respect and kindness, Pope Francis called caring for creation 'ecological virtues' which help people live in ways that respect God's world.
English	Children will revise all the spelling and grammar skills covered in Year 2 including: the use of suffixes (-ness, -ful, -less, -ment, -ly), subordinating and co-ordinating conjunctions (when, if, that, because, or, and, but), different sentence types (statement, command, question, exclamation), correctly forming the past, present and future tense and a range of punctuation (capital letters, full stops, question marks, exclamation marks, commas in a list, apostrophes for possession and contraction). Children will continue to practise their reading skills of retrieval, inference, prediction, sequencing whilst developing their understanding of vocabulary. We will be writing setting descriptions inspired by the story 'Sand Wizards' and information texts linked to our trip to Packwood House and Gardens.
Maths	Place Value -reading and counting in in hundreds, tens and ones up to 1000, comparing and ordering numbers, number patterns, counting in fours and eights, addition and subtraction methods, revision of $\times 2, 5, 10$ multiplication tables and beginning to learn $\times 3, 4, 8$ multiplication tables.
Science	Our science topic will be Plants. We will explore the different parts of a plant and their different functions. Also to explore why different plants need different amounts of water, light and heat to grow and stay healthy. Investigate how water is transported inside plants and the life cycle of a flowering plant.
PE	Net/Strike Field Games: Apply throwing, catching and hitting skills whilst developing an understanding of the basic games rules e.g. Tennis, Cricket and Rounders.
Art	We will continue to develop our sketching skills and learn how to add colour and tone to pictures of different types of gardens. Artists study - Van Gogh. Respond to paintings by van Gogh and recreate artwork in the style/technique of Van Gogh. Compare and contrast Van Gogh with Birmingham artist - Beverly Booth.
Computing	Children will recap the SMART rules. Focus on self-image/ identity online. We will be creating a digital worksheet using J2e5. We will be learning how to manipulate and edit images and text to aid presentation.
Music	Learn hymns and songs relating to topic 'Gardens'. Perform in solo and group ensembles using voices with increasing accuracy and fluency. Appreciate a variety of music from different composers and different traditions
DT	We will be Investigating, design and create a pneumatic toy. Once completed, we will then evaluate and improve finished pneumatic toys.
Geography/History	Study how Gardens have changed throughout time starting with the uses of growing crops in early settlements (Skara Brae) and leading onto how industrialisation shaped our use of gardens. Study Neolithic Age (New Stone Age), how these people lived as hunters and gatherers and the impact of this on future events.
Spanish	We will begin by understanding why learning another language is important and then we will explore where Spanish is spoken. The focus then will be learning how to greet someone and begin to learn numbers and colours. Phonic sounds will be introduced to help pronunciation and set the basis for when we begin to read in Spanish.
